# potty-training/ KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE: JUMPING INTO THE

**HARBOUR** 

As warmer weather approaches we know that many of our children join older children in jumping into the harbour from height. Although this may be great fun there are also many dangers that parents should be aware of and discuss with children.

-Jumping from a height into water is particularly dangerous as water depth can be unpredictable as it changes with the tide.

-Water can often be shallower than it appears from above.

-Other dangers include the shock of cold water, which can be as low as 15C in the summer.

-The impact of jumping into dramatically cooler water can make it difficult to swim, or unanticipated currents can sweep swimmers away.
-Entry into the water as well can be

-Entry into the water as well can be dangerous as your body position can change resulting in a belly-flop or landing on your back.

-Murky water can also camouflage an array of hazards such as rocks or other sharp objects - meaning many are jumping into the unknown.
