Please continue to support your child with their home reading book. We encourage pupils to read the text three times (although not on the same evening!). The first read is to become familiar with new vocabulary, the second read is to discuss and understand the text e.g. feelings of character, reasons for actions, structure of the story. The third read is for your child to confidently read and enjoy the text with pace and fluency. Remember you can record other texts you have shared with your child in their blue reading record.
