YEAR 4 VISIT TO WOODHORN

This week our Year 4 Penguins class enjoyed a trip to Woodhorn Colliery Museum as part of their current topic about World War I. They looked at the 'Weeping Window' poppies artwork and took some great photographs of this. They then looked at the strong links that there were between mining and World War I and they followed the life of a soldier called George Buglass through a range of archived papers that tracked his enlistment, medical checks, injury records and eventual death.
