




Understanding the World

This half term we are going to be preparing for our class assembly about 'The Gruffalo'. We will be reading the story and finding out about the characters.

As it gets closer to Christmas we will be very busy with lots of activities such as making cards, calendars and Christmas surprises. We will also learning lots of new songs in preparation for our Christmas play which we will be performing during the last week of term.



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Mathematics

We will be continuing to do lots of counting, recognising and ordering numbers up to 10. Some of us will even be moving onto numbers up to 20. As well as playing lots of games involving numbers we will also be comparing the size, shape and length of different objects from Santas, to Snowmen and stockings. We will be concentrating on using language such as long, short, tall, wide, narrow, thin and thick to describe these objects.

<u>Literacy</u>

Over the next 7 weeks we will be continuing to practise our reading by blending sounds together. Some of us are even going to be writing words—our Fred fingers will help us to do this (chi ching!) We will be bringing reading books home every night which we will be sharing at home. Look out for our stickers to see which new sounds we have been learning.
