HEALTHY PACKED LUNCHES

Along with this newsletter we have enclosed a copy of our packed lunches policy and some information from Jane, our School Nurse, about packed lunches. On a daily basis we see a wide range of packed lunches that the children bring into school that vary greatly in content, quantity and nutritional value. We hope that parents of children who bring a packed lunch find this information useful and that it may help more children have more healthy and nutritious packed lunches whilst also saving parents money at the same time.

Please note that all children in Reception to Y2 are entitled to a free school meal through the government's Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme. There are always at least 2 meal choices along with access to our salad bar and options can be chosen at home, online with parents. Why not give them a try? Dinners for all other children (unless entitled to Free School Meals) cost £2.20 per day or £11.00 per week.



THE AMBLE LINKS 3RS

At Amble Links, one of our key aims is for our children to become Responsible, Respectful and Resilient young people. We know that, if they consistently demonstrate these, that they will have a good start towards becoming good citizens. We promote these through our 3 Rs Robots which are on display in the hall and in classrooms and reinforce these through regular



assemblies. More details about the 3Rs Robots can be found on the SCHOOL WEBSITE.

For the age of our children, we keep things very simple and give them some examples of how they can demonstrate these. We ask that parents also encourage the children to demonstrate their 3 Rs wherever possible. Some key examples we use are asking the children to take responsibility for carrying their own bags to and from school and bringing what they need to school each day. We ask them to show respect by appreciating that everyone is different and using good manners. We ask them to be resilient by trying to do things for themselves and not giving
