Year 3 Visit to Segedunum

This week, our Y3 Sharks enjoyed a visit to the museum to learn more for their topic, 'The Rotten Romans'. While they were there they explored the ruins of the Roman fort and even took part in a mock battle between the Romans and the Celts on Hadrian's Wall. The children took on the role of Roman soldiers and completed a training drill which included marching, polishing weapons and saying an oath of allegiance to the commanding officer. The children gained a valuable insight into the life of a Roman soldier which has helped us plan for writing diaries from the point of view of a Roman soldier. Again, we were really proud of the children's behaviour and would like to thank the volunteers who gave up their time to make the day so successful.
