#### SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Good attendance at school is a key factor in children doing well at school. As a school we are also judged by Ofsted on how good our attendance is. Over recent years we have achieved above national average attendance figures which is really positive. Unfortunately, our figures for this year so far are not as good for a number of reasons including the outbreak of chickenpox and the stomach bug before Christmas which were unavoidable. Holidays taken during term time have also added to this situation. Parents are reminded that if children are feeling slightly 'under the weather' they should still be sent to school—if they are genuinely ill we will quickly notice and send them home. Please note though that if children have sickness or diarrhoea they should be kept off school for 48 hours to prevent spread of these. PARENTS ARE ALSO REMINDED THAT CHILDREN WHO ARE OFF SCHOOL POORLY SHOULD NOT BE BROUGHT TO FRIDAY ASSEMBLIES. We hope that we can begin to achieve our weekly attendance stars again soon and have attendance figures closer to our target of 97%

#### PUNCTUALITY CHALLENGE

Unfortunately, over the last 2 half terms the children have not received their whole school treat for achieving our lateness targets.
