Mathematics

Much will be covered in mathematics this half term. This includes:



Arithmetic: Place value up to 4 digits, adding

and subtracting, multiplication and equivalent fractions.

<u>Data and Measure</u>: Finding the area of shapes and reading the time with increasing accuracy.

Geometry: Identifying and describing the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

The Great War and WWII

In this history topic, the children will learn about World War 1. They will gain an understanding of British history, the causes of war and this will

then link in to the end of the war and remembrance.



Within this topic, the children will also explore the work of artist Claude Monet and produce their own work based on this.

A trip is being organised for the children to go to Beamish for the day where they will take part in a workshop entitled WW2 Evacuees. It will be a unique opportunity to explore the experiences children had as they were taken from their homes and families to the relatively safety of the countryside as war loomed.

The children will write about these experiences in the form of a recount and also apply their knowledge to writing their own story based on 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'.
