Since our last newsletter, renovations have been completed at our 13th partner school, Kawawa Primary. The UK team visited Kawawa in October and were presented with gifts of cooking pots as a thankyou. Work has since begun on our 14th school Mbuo Primary, and will be completed early this year.

December was a month of celebrations in Tanzania for our preprimary students. Soon to be starting standard 1, the schools held graduation ceremonies for them. One of the schools, Singino, took the opportunity to hold a fundraising event at the same time. The parents and local community successfully raised the equivalent of £55. This is a huge achievement which will enable the school to pay for porridge for the children during the school day.
