COVID UPDATE

Although most Covid restrictions in the community have now been lifted, we continue to take a very cautious approach in school and are still trying to limit contacts where possible. We continue to follow government guidance and ensure that there is regular handwashing and sanitising in school, additional cleaning is in place and that classrooms are well ventilated. We continue to see a small number of cases amongst pupils and staff. Government guidance should still be followed with regard to Covid cases which include arranging a test if you have any Covid symptoms and isolate if you test positive. Lateral flow can be taken on days 5 and 6 of isolation and if these are negative then isolation can end. Although isolation is not now a legal requirement it is important to follow guidance to avoid spreading the virus in school. At present, we have no plans for offering large events in which parents are invited into school such as weekly assemblies as cases nationally remain high and we must do whatever we can to protect our pupils and staff.

BOOK CLUB RESTARTING

Our Book Club with Mrs Graham will be restarting on Tuesday 15th March. The club is open to children in Y2 to Y4 and will run each week until 4pm. The club runs in the library and the children enjoy reading books quietly and together as well as taking part in reading related activities. Please let Mrs Dellbridge know if you would like your child to join this club which is free of charge.

ORDERING SCHOOL DINNERS

Thanks to all parents who have been ordering school dinners online at home through School Grid. Doing this saves us a huge amount of time each morning in school meaning the children can quickly get on with their learning.

OUR ONE WAY SYSTEM

We initially brought in our one way system to support the Covid restrictions we had in place. We very quickly realised that the system has huge benefits to how smoothly and safely we are able



to run drop off and pick up times. These times have been far more settled allowing the children to come quickly into school and get on with their work. At the end of the school day we also find it much easier to safely pair children with the adults who are collecting them. Following the success of this we surveyed parents about continuing the system; the vast majority said they would prefer this to continue. In recent weeks we have noticed a number of adults not following this system. Please support us by helping keep the consistency that is necessary to make the one way system work. We appreciate that it adds a short walk and a couple minutes on to journey times but we believe this is a fair pay off for increased safety.
