DOODLEMATHS STREAK SAVERS

As you will see from some of our assembly awards for Doodlemaths, many of the children work towards achieving 'streaks' which reflect the number of consecutive days they have Doodled. A streak will drop back to zero if they forget to Doodle for 2 days. Streaks are designed to encourage healthy, regular use of Doodlemaths. For this reason, we will only reinstate streaks in very exceptional circumstances. Doodlemaths does, though, have a feature called 'Streak Saver'. Streak Savers can be earned when a child completes 5 days of Doodling and it is possible to save up to a maximum of 2 Streak Savers. A Streak Saver can be used for a break of between 2 days and 2 weeks. If children know that they are not going to be able to Doodle for a few days, a streak saver can be applied in advance. Streak Savers can also be used if a child has an unexpected break from Doodling and will be given an option to use a Streak Saver (if they have one) when they next log in! EARRINGS IN SCHOOL

We continue to experience issues with earrings in school despite numerous requests. For safety reasons, earrings must not be worn for PE or swimming and, if children are unable to remove these themselves, they should come to school with them already removed. Clear silicone retainers are a good option to ensure holes stay open. We will contact parents and ask them to come to school to remove earrings if necessary. Taping of earrings is not now deemed to be a safe option, As per our uniform policy, only small plain stud earrings are acceptable in school at other times. We recommend that any new piercings are made at the start of school holidays. We ask parents to support us with these expectations in order to avoid a blanket ban on earrings that some schools now have in place.
