## PUNCTUALITY

On our first day back of a new term, we unfortunately had 16 children recorded as being late for school. For comparison, we often have a lower total than that for a whole week. We appreciate that poor weather conditions may be accountable for a few of these latenesses but it is important that ALL children get to school on time on a daily basis.

School starts at **8.30am** for children in Year 3 to Year 6 and at **8.40am** for children in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. Doors close 5 minutes after these times. Children arriving after these times are marked as late. Schools are very much based on the children working to routines in order for them to have a predictable schedule. When they are late for school, it means that they are out of routine from the outset and this can lead to an unsettled day. Please note that we offer a FREE Breakfast Club for children in Reception to Y6 with entry from 8am and last entry at 8.20am. Children who attend Breakfast Club are never late for school!

We will continue to reward children with our half termly 'In to Win' Challenge, but children with any more than one late mark are not entered into the draw, even if children have 100% attendance. I hope that this email will help many more of our children arrive at school on time during the coming weeks and months.

## SCHOOL MEALS UPDATE

We'd like to thank parents for their support with providing packed lunches to help alleviate pressure in the school kitchen while Mrs Christie, our Kitchen Manager, is unwell. It is likely that she will be absent from work for some time. We plan to have more cooked meal options available from Tuesday 20th January and are just finalising that menu. Next week we will again be providing a choice of jacket potatoes or packed lunches. We ask that ALL parents complete the online form that has been sent out again by email. This helps us know exactly how many meals to prepare.
