PACKED LUNCH GUIDANCE

We have recently reviewed our packed lunch guidance. We keep a close eye on packed lunches and communicate any concerns with parents where necessary. What we are finding is that some packed lunches contain way too much food for the children and are often made up of mainly processed foods that contain large amounts of sugar and fat. This leads to packed lunches brought from home becoming very expensive, especially when much of the food provided is wasted.

PLEASE DO NOT SEND SWEETS OR FIZZY DRINKS IN PACKED LUNCHES. Nurse Jane is also available to discuss healthy packed lunches with parents .
