FRUIT FOR BREAKTIME IN KS2

Unlike in KS1, children in KS2 are not provided with a fruit snack at school. From Monday, we are going to trial allowing the children in KS2 to bring a piece of fruit to school each day to have at breaktime. In order to keep this as simple as possible and ensure that litter does not become a problem we are going to specify that they may bring an apple, pear or banana for break time. This will be kept (separate from any packed lunch) in their bag until breaktime. We will monitor how this works for us and for the children and make a decision as to whether we will continue this in a few weeks. Please do not send other fruit in with the children for breaktime.

PACKED LUNCHES

Although we do not strictly monitor packed lunches, we do have a packed lunch policy. Please note that sweets are not allowed in packed lunches—we are still seeing packets of Haribo type sweets being sent in. We also ask that if grapes are sent in for younger children, they should be cut in half as there is a choking risk with full grapes. Please support us with this.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

We are delighted to be able to offer 8 after school clubs to a range of pupils across school. Many parents have used our digital form this week to apply for places. All children that applied have been given a place in at least one of their club choices..

Where places were not allocated, we have placed children on waiting lists. YOU WILL RECEIVE A LETTER FOR EACH CLUB THAT YOUR CHILD HAS BEEN ALLOCATED. Please read this carefully as it explains club times, start date and where children need to be collected from. Many of our clubs are now full but we still have places available at: Karaoke Club (Y3-6 Tuesdays), and Cheerleading (Y4-6 Thursdays). Please contact school if you would like a place for your child. If you have not received a letter, we have not been able to allocate a place at the moment.

Please note that Lego Club will not start until 23rd September.

SPARE BALANCE BIKES

We are currently on the lookout for any balance bikes or nursery/reception sized bike helmets that might be going spare for our Early Years children to use in their outdoor play area. If you have one that is in good condition and unused we'd be happy to take it off your hands—Thank you!

SMARTPHONES & WATCHES

We have a strict policy on mobile phones in school; This is a part of our safeguarding procedures. Although children in Y4 and upwards are allowed to bring phones to school they must turn them off at the school gate before putting them in a bag or a pocket; phones must then be handed to the class teacher for safe keeping during the day. Phones should not be turned back on until the children have left the school premises. This also applies to smart watches that can take photos or connect to the internet. Children persistently not following our expectations will not be allowed to bring phones to school.

SCHOOL LOTTERY

We run a weekly school lottery through 'Your School Lottery'. This offers a weekly prize to a ticketholder from our school—this prize grows as more people buy tickets. CHILDREN WALKING TO SCHOOL UNSUPERVISED

As our pupils get older many parents choose to allow the children to walk to school unsupervised. Please note that the children are not supervised on the school yard when they arrive. It is vital that children walking alone do not arrive at school too early as this can often lead to poor behaviour. We have challenged a number of children about this already and will insist on parents bringing children to school should this issue become persistent.
